Bright red-ruby. Lively aromas of red berries and eucalyptus. Sweet and juicy, with intense red berry fruitiness but also a fairly strong mintiness. Finishes firmly tannic but not at all dry, with good persistence. From a coolish, long growing season in Clare Valley that featured low crop levels.

Lean, with cedary overtones to the spicy blackberry flavors, finishing focused and crisp. Give it time to flesh out.



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
