94 pts “Good hue and clarity; a full-bodied pinot in the expected style of Yarra Yering; supple and velvety in the mouth, it has the full spectrum of plum, black cherry and spice flavours which carry the generous amount of new oak. Long lived style.”

92 pts “Vivid red. Strong red and dark berry aromas are complicated by rose, dark chocolate, herbs and smoky minerals; this is Burgundian in its interplay of fruit, minerals and earth. Suave, sweet raspberry and blackcurrant flavors coat the palate and are energized by brisk minerals. Gains sweetness with air and finishes with a late jolt of bitter blood orange. I really like the mix of depth and energy that this wine offers.”
