93 pts “Deep red. Intensely perfumed bouquet of red and dark berries, Asian spices, smoky minerals and potpourri. Silky in texture, with sweet raspberry and blackberry flavors, a sexy candied floral quality and refreshing back-end cut. The finish strongly repeats the mineral element and clings with excellent juicy persistence. This is delicious now, but I’d bet on it rewarding at least another five years of aging.”

90 pts “This wine presents a conundrum: It’s not at all what most wine drinkers would expect a pinot noir to be, though fine pinot noir is suppose to be an interpreter of terroir rather than varietally expressive, and this is about as Yarra a wine as you will find. It’s tense, rosy, filled with the scent of the forest floor after a rain. The alcohol is apparent in a cherry liqueur-like finish, but the wine leaves the mouth feeling fresh. A complex wine that will reward five to ten years in the cellar.”
