Review Summary



93 pts “Made from some of the oldest pinot noir vines in the Yarra Valley, and clearly the result of a very good vintage. Balance is the key. Meaty. Savory. Lovely lick of cedary, creamy oak - though it’s only a lick. Lots of stalky, twiggy, earthen notes. Body flavors of beetroot, dark cherry, Asian spice. Beautiful balance. Beautiful length. Could possibly be ‘brighter’ in its fruit expression, though it should age like a charm. Impressive wine.”

91 pts “Matured in 50% new French oak, the 2008 Pinot Noir is bright medium ruby colored with slightly subdued, yet fragrant, aromas of raspberry, cherry and allspice, plus nuances of espresso and dried herbs. The full body has good concentration with medium-high acid and a medium level of fine grained tannins. There's a touch of mocha coming through in the long finish. Approachable now, best to give this wine another year in bottle and enjoy to 2016+.”
